INTRODUCTION

Puzzle Time

Puzzle Time is for students of English. There are four *Puzzle Time* books, and each book has a number of interesting word puzzles which will help you learn English. Each *Puzzle Time* book uses words only from the Penguin Readers.

Puzzle Time 2

There are 30 puzzles in *Puzzle Time 2*. The words in these puzzles come from *Easystarts* and Levels 1 to 3 of the Penguin Readers. You can use this book in class or at home. You will find the answers to every puzzle at the back of the book. There is also a list of all the important words from the puzzles at the back of the book.

Puzzle Time words

There are a few words in *Puzzle Time 2* which are not from Levels 1 to 3 of the Penguin Readers. These special 'puzzle words' are:

adjective *Interesting, great, friendly* are *adjectives*.

anagram *Own* is an *anagram* of *won*. (It has the same letters in a different order.)

clue A *clue* helps you answer a question or complete a puzzle.

crossword A *crossword* is a type of puzzle:



idiom In an *idiom*, some of the words have a special meaning.

jigsaw A *jigsaw* is a type of puzzle:



- puzzle There are *puzzles* on nearly every page of *Puzzle Time 2*!
- verb *To run, to talk, to like* are verbs.
- vowels Vowels are the letters A, E, I, O and U.

New words

You have to learn a lot of words when you learn a language. These ideas will help you.

- 1 Write new words in a notebook. You can write a different word family (see puzzle 6) on each page. Write the English word and then write the same word in your language next to it. Use each word in a short sentence:
dollar My new jacket cost fifty dollars.
- 2 When you read a story or something in your English book, learn ten or fifteen important words from it. Then try to write the story again. Use the new words and other easy words.
- 3 Work with a friend. Write twenty or thirty new words on small pieces of paper. Put them into a box or an envelope. Take two words from the box and use them in a sentence. Then your friend takes two words and makes a sentence. Use every word from the box!
- 4 Learn some new words and write your own puzzle with those words. (The puzzles in this book will give you some ideas.) Then give your puzzle to your friend. He or she writes the answers in the puzzle.
