Konjunktiv II - Past Time with Modal Verbs(Double Infinitive)

The following grammar pertains to actions that:

- · would have occured in the past time (but didn't, so they are expressed in the subjunctive mood)
- · contain a modal verb such as could or should (examples include should have, could have, might have, etc.)

Examples:

We <u>could have gone</u> to Leipzig last summer. (but we didn't)
Wir <u>hätten</u> nach Leipzig <u>fahren können.</u>
You should have seen the movie. (but you didn't)
Du hättest den Film sehen sollen.

German uses three verbs in a single sentence to express past time subjunctive with a modal.

- · The conjugated verb is always a form of hätt_ (hätte, hättest, hätten, etc.)
- · (The conjugated verb in this construction is always hätt_ and never wär_ regardless of the other verbs.)
- · The other two verbs appear next to each other at the end of the sentence as infinitives.
- · They always appear in the order: lexical modal.
- · This construction with two infinitives at the end is called the double infinitive construction.

Examples:

• 'should have done'

Note that German makes a difference between weak obligation (sollen) and strong obligation (müssen). Examples:

- · You should have read the novel. Du hättest den Roman lesen sollen.

 (It was interesting, and I think you would have enjoyed it. sollen weak obligation)
- · You should have read the novel. Du hättest den Roman lesen müssen.

 (You failed the questions on our last exam by not having read the novel. müssen strong obligation)
