

# Word Order Types in German - Introduction

**Main Word Order** (also called *Normal* or *Declarative* or *Statement* word order)

Fore Field one element	1 <sup>st</sup> Verb Field one conjugated verb	Sentence Field all remaining elements	2 <sup>nd</sup> Verb Field all non-conjugated verb elements	
Am Montag	spielen	wir immer Karten .		We always play cards on Monday.
Erik	muss	bald seinen Großvater	besuchen .	Erik has to visit his grandfather soon.
Gestern	hat	mir mein Bruder ein Geburtstagsgeschenk	gegeben .	Yesterday, my brother gave me a birthday present.

**Information Question** (based on the expected response that a specific piece of information will be given)

Question Word question element in the fore field	1 <sup>st</sup> Verb Field one conjugated verb	Sentence Field all remaining elements	2 <sup>nd</sup> Verb Field all non-conjugated verb elements	
Wann	kommst	du nach Hause ?		When are you coming home?
Wo	wohnt	jetzt deine Schwester ?		Where does your sister live now?
Was	wollt	ihr am Wochenende	machen ?	What do you guys want to do on the weekend?
Wie lange	hat	gestern der Unterricht	gedauert ?	How long did class go yesterday?

**Yes-No Question** (based on the expected response that either *yes* or *no* will be given)

1 <sup>st</sup> Verb Field one conjugated verb	Sentence Field all remaining elements	2 <sup>nd</sup> Verb Field all non-conjugated verb elements	
Lernt	Robert jetzt Deutsch ?		Is Robert learning German now?
Können	wir morgen im Park einen Spaziergang	machen ?	Can we take a walk in the park tomorrow?
Hast	du gestern mit Erika	telefoniert?	Did you talk with Erika on the phone yesterday?

**Color Coding:** Blue indicates simple sentence with single verb. Teal indicates sentence with modal verb + infinitive. Flesh indicates present perfect tense with tense auxiliary and participle.
